FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation in land and buildings.

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable law and the accounting standards issued by the Accounting Standards Board and promutgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Iratand (Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in Iratand), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

1.3 Income

Income generally represents amounts received and receivable. Donetions received in coin boxes in McDonald's stores and third party fundraising donations are only credited as Income when they are lodged to the company's bank account.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

1.5 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of qualifying employees. Contributions payable are charged to the income and expenditure account in the year they are payable.

1.6 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into euro at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet data. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the income and expenditure account.
